**Varex Imaging Corporation  
Conflict Minerals Policy**

In response to concerns that profits from the sale of certain minerals mined in the Democratic Republic of Congo (the “DNC”) and adjoining countries are being used to finance armed conflict, the United States Congress enacted Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the “Act”). In accordance with the Act, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) has issued a final conflict minerals rule (the “Conflict Minerals Rule”). The Conflict Minerals Rule requires publicly traded companies to disclose whether their products contain columbite-tantalite, cassiterite, gold, or wolframite, including their derivatives (coltan, tin, and tungsten), sourced from the DNC or its adjoining countries. When these minerals are sourced from the DRC and its adjoining countries they are commonly referred to as “conflict minerals”.

Varex Imaging Corporation (“Varex”) supports efforts to eliminate the use of conflict minerals sourced from the DNC and its adjoining countries. As a related matter, Varex is committed to complying with Section 1502 of the Act and with nationally and internationally recognized frameworks for conflict minerals due diligence. Among other things, for all new vendors and for contract renewals with existing vendors, Varex requires such vendors to:

- exercise due diligence on the source and chain of custody of conflict minerals in the products they provide to Varex;
- disclose any use of conflict minerals in materials or products supplied to Varex; and
- provide Varex with a description of the measures taken to assure the appropriate sourcing and chain of custody of any conflict minerals.

Varex will publicly disclose information related to conflict minerals as well as all other information required by the Act. Varex also expects its suppliers to comply with the requirements applicable to them under the Act. If Varex becomes aware of a supplier who is not in compliance with the Act or Varex’s policies, we will take appropriate action, which may include reassessment or termination of the supplier relationship.
